- 4. Interpret the goals and objectives of Lutherlyn to your congregation.
- 5. Encourage your congregation to conduct retreats and other outings at Lutherlyn.
- 6. Keep your congregation informed of the maintenance and financial needs of the camp.
- 7. Represent Lutherlyn in the congregation by answering questions, providing feedback, sharing visions, and identifying concerns that might help Lutherlyn more fully meet the needs of your congregation.
- 8. Keep in consistent contact with members of Lutherlyn staff to maintain awareness of news and upcoming events worth sharing.
- 9. Attend the free Ambassador's weekend retreat each spring to keep up-to-date on programs and developments at camp.

THE UNIQUE ROLE OF OUTDOOR MINISTRIES

When it comes to ministry, the local congregation is where most of the action takes place. It begins with Baptism, continues with instruction in Sunday Church School, and preparation for Holy Communion, followed by catechetical instruction. Educational ministry in the church is a life long process centered in the Word of God and the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

Partners - Lutherlyn exists for no other reason than to support the ministry of congregations. Our goals and objectives are the same. Lutherlyn is an extension of the life and ministry of the parish in a unique, natural setting.

SUMMER CAMP:

An experiment in Christian living -

Lutherlyn nurtures an Intentional Christian Community into which the children and youth of the congregations of our synods are welcomed. A week-long session of peer group living gives our children the chance to see if the lessons of Christian living they learned in church really work. Under the guidance of highly trained counselors, campers have the opportunity to be "Christians away from home" and to explore in real life the nature of living together in love.

A place to learn about God – Through devotions, Bible study, worship, and dialogue, children

made aware of the reconciling love of God in Christ. They hear again the call to discipleship and to stewardship of the earth and of one another. The example of faith in life modeled by staff and chaplains through their conduct and shared grace moments

encourages learning.

A place to learn about God's creation - Lutherlyn's setting and emphasis on environmental education provides a unique opportunity to begin to understand their role as caretakers of the earth. We teach children to live in harmony with the earth, not as careless consumers.

A leadership training school for the church

- Each summer over 65 high school and college students are hired to serve as staff. After two weeks of the most intensive and comprehensive training offered to any camp staff, these young adults assume the responsibility for conducting the program for the summer. Most of our staff go on to active leadership in congregations and some enter full time church work as pastors, youth directors, or camp professionals.

A view of the church beyond the congregation - It is important for children to see the church beyond their congregation, to meet Christians from other places, to hear the Word proclaimed in new ways by other pastors. Children meeting and worshiping with new friends discover that their God is the Lord and Savior of the universe and not just their hometown.

WHAT MAKES LUTHERLYN UNIQUE?

- 1. A total commitment to excellence has led Lutherlyn to earn and maintain American Camping Association Accreditation. Our Executive director is certified through the ACA. This represents an uncommon commitment to health, safety, quality, and professional standards of ethics and operation.
- 3. A commitment to individual campers rather than to attendance figures and the bottom line. We make sure campers get the individual attention they need. Our staff is trained to "seek out the one" and attend to those things that help campers build self-esteem, a sense of being accepted, and a sense of being beloved children of God.
- 4. A commitment to making sure that every child can be a camper at Lutherlyn regardless of financial resources. Our campership program has meant that NO ONE has ever been turned away because they were unable to pay.
- 5. Our staff training program is unequaled in intensity and thoroughness of skills taught and areas addressed.
- 6. A commitment to offering the widest possible selection of quality program choices for campers and a willingness to experiment. In the ongoing effort to address the evolving needs of the people we serve, Lutherlyn is constantly generating new programs.
- 7. A commitment to developing and using cutting edge "experiential" curriculum. We know that people learn best by doing and that the best "teaching" is done by creating a positive environment in which people desire to learn
- 8. Our approach to quality music, the intentional sharing of Mission, sharing of "Grace Moments" at campfires, and our closing "Affirmation Service" with its emphasis on personal blessing, are unique.
- 9. Among the other Lutheran sites doing environmental education, Lutherlyn has the most complete and teacher responsive program of all.

What Happens at Lutherlyn?

Summer Programs

Residential Camp: About 1,200 campers participate in the wide variety of programs offered on site each summer. Everyone participates in daily devotions, worship, Bible study, crafts, recreation, nature study, making new friends, and experiencing the Gospel in daily living. Our program is based on a small group model in which staff can take time to give campers individual attention. We offer a wide variety of special focus camps that offer skills development in such things as photography, music, horseback riding, building models rockets and trains, and environmental studies. There are also special weeks for first through fourth graders, senior high students, people who are night owls, and a week for families.

Off-Site: Some summer programs are conducted on the road or at sites away from Lutherlyn. The Adventurer program offers campers a different adventure each day and returns to camp in the evening. Activities include, rock climbing, canoeing, hiking, biking, etc.

Day Camp: Between 200 and 300 first through fifth graders participate annually in Day Camp programs conducted at about 15 parishes throughout our synods. Our Lutherlyn staff "brings camp" to congregations.

Hosted Camps: Not all programs conducted at Lutherlyn are led by Lutherlyn staff. The camp is "Accredited" by the American Camp Association for use by contract groups who lead most or all of their own program. Each summer about 100 campers attend Confirmation Camp weeks in which pastors and lay teachers bring their confirmation classes for a week of group building and study. Community non-profit groups also conduct camps at Lutherlyn. The Camp Cadet-PA State Police, Muscular Dystrophy Association, school bands, and others have used Lutherlyn and some Lutherlyn staff for their camp programs.

Year-Round Programs (Retreats and Events)

Lutherlyn hosts over 5,000 people through retreats and rental groups. Slightly over half of our retreaters are adults. Over 4,500 people a year come to Lutherlyn for one day events.

Programmed Retreats: Lutherlyn holds specific Lutherlyn program retreats each year. Some of these include Wild Women Weekend, Fathers and Sons Retreat, Advent Retreat, and Winter Youth Retreats. Crafting and Quilting retreats have been a popular option in the last few years. Mystery Quilt Retreat, Santa's Workshop Retreat, Crafty Lady Retreat, and Unfinished Objects Retreat are held throughout the year.

Rental Retreats: These multiple day retreats involve just about every kind of group imaginable: youth groups, church councils, women's groups, men's groups, confirmation classes, family groups, couples, individuals, committees, classes, schools and so on. Winterized cabins and meeting spaces make rental opportunities available year-round.

Open Invitational Events: Others attend events such as Camp Blast (Open House), Spring and Fall Work Days, Environmental Education Saturday Safaris, Woodland Quilters Quilt Show, and Halloween Family Fun Day.

Self-Conducted: Many attend events utilizing the facilities available such as: weddings, family reunions, congregational picnics, and meetings.

Program-Offered Scheduled Events:

Some also avail themselves of opportunities offered including horseback riding, hay rides, high and low ropes course, and swimming.

Environmental Education

Field Trips: Parochial, private, and public school students are coming by busloads to participate in our excellent Lutherlyn Environmental Education Program (LEEP). This past year LEEP has also conducted training with Seminary students and other Environmental Education programs. Each year LEEP hosts around 100 schools and 6000 students. It is the only such program in which teachers can design their field trips to supplement what is actually being studied in the classroom. The LEEP program offers over 100 topic modules that can be mixed and matched to suit the teacher's goals. Out *sweetest* program is maple sugaring. In 1996, Lutherlyn welcomed the Terra Dei Homestead to the Environmental curriculum – featuring Pennsylvania's first straw bale home, an organic garden, and a glimpse into practical "green" lifestyles.

Group Outings: Programs may be scheduled for church groups, youth groups, adult groups, garden clubs, and business organizations. These programs may involve nature hikes and activities or tours of Terra Dei Homestead. Often, these programs are scheduled during a retreat or conference, but can be done independently.

Saturday Safaris: Days designed for individuals and families are made available each year. Activities have included Birdhouse making, Wolves, Survival Skills of the Woodland Tribes, archaeology, Maple Sugaring, and Dog Sledding. These events are provided at minimal cost and are a great activity to do on a Saturday.

LEEP into School: Lutherlyn's renowned Environmental Education Program comes to your school! The LEEP staff has developed in-school activity modules for children in pre-school through fifth grade. All of the modules include hands-on experiences with real (but not live) animal specimens from Lutherlyn's Eberly Environmental Education Center, games, stories, and the knowledge of the LEEP staff members. The activities are based on state standards for primary and early childhood education. The LEEP staff offer these traveling programs for the months of November through March.

Terra Dei Homestead: The Terra Dei Homestead was designed to be an example of what people can do to conserve energy and resources. Conserving energy not only allows us to use less fossil fuels, it also reduces the amount of acid rain produced, decreases air pollution, and decreases water pollution. Many of the materials that went into the construction of the house were reused, and several products made of recycled materials are highlighted inside.

Programs at Terra Dei Homestead encourage students to consider the environmental implications of their lifestyles and explore every day solutions to ecological problems. Customized, hands-on programs may include alternative energy sources, energy efficiency, integrated pest management, and organic gardening. Many activities focus on the demonstration house at Terra Dei Homestead. It is the first straw bale house built in Pennsylvania and features a myriad of conservation technologies.

Teacher Workshops/Naturalist Training: Teacher Workshops are available for educators who wish to expand their knowledge of the environment and obtain useful classroom resources. Each workshop participant receives an activity guide and experiences sample activities. Act 48 credit is available through Intermediate Unit 4. Lunch is provided as part of the program.

Scout Projects: Eagle Scout Projects are available at Lutherlyn and are administered through L.E.E.P. Past projects have included trail maintenance, garden path construction, bridge building, and picnic table construction.

Food Service/Receptions

The dining hall is a central and very important place at camp. It is equipped to meet the needs of groups and events of varying sizes and specifications. Meals are typically served in an all-you-can-eat buffet style. During the summer, campers sit with their fellow cabin groups and eat meals prepared by our experienced Food Service Director and Staff.

Meals are well-balanced and nutritious. Each meal is prepared with a vegetarian option in addition to a salad bar for lunches and dinners. We strive to meet the needs of all dietary restrictions. If a member of your group has specific needs, our Food Service Director would be happy to accommodate them.

Wedding receptions and banquets are also available and can be customized to the needs of the renting party. Lutherlyn has an exclusive catering agreement with Medure's Catering in New Castle for receptions.

Equestrian Programs

Lutherlyn Equestrian Program strives to provide children/people with a safe and positive learning experience. We want them to leave our facility feeling confident about the experience they had here. Many of our horses have spent their lives teaching children the joy of riding. Our facilities include a bank barn and a 20 shed row style barn with 10x10 box stalls, a heated tack room, 85'x150' indoor riding sand arena, a stadium jumping field, a cross country course of Intro-Novice, and miles and miles of beautiful trails.

Summer Programs: Enjoy a fantastic week of learning about horses, improving your skills, and riding in a beautiful setting! Instruction is offered for riders of all abilities by instructors that are certified through the American Association of Horsemanship Safety. All horse camp programs spend their "non-horse" time doing lots of great Classic Camp activities! Horse camp is designed to allow campers to progress in their riding skills. Each camper can progress through the levels of horse camp by demonstrating competency in their riding skills. After returning home, each camper will receive a certificate informing them of the level that they will be able to attend the next summer. First time junior campers (grades 4-6) will start at level 1. First time Jr. High and Sr. High campers (grades 7-12) will start at level 2.

Horse-Owner/Experienced Programs: Lutherlyn Equestrian has a variety of special programming designed for those who are more experienced in horsemanship and those who own their own horses. We have been working hard to expand the programming at the Lutherlyn Stables. Programs offered include: Hunter Paces, AAHS Riding Certification, Cross Country Schooling, Eventing Camp, Mini Trials, Judged Pleasure Trail Ride, Private and Group Lessons, and Guided Trail Rides.

Non-Horse Owner Programs: You don't have to own a horse to love horses or to gain experience working with them! Lutherlyn Stables have many great horses that are used to programs for those who do not own their own horse. Programs include Mini Horse Camps, Equestrian Gym Classes for Homeschoolers, aTherapeutic Ridinga Program, and Group Trail Rides.

Woodland Center for Arts & Crafts

The Woodland Center for Arts & Crafts is a program of Lutherlyn designed to bring opportunities for creative expression, arts education and spiritual formation. This program currently has two specific specialties:

Woodland Pottery & Studio

The Woodland Studio for Pottery inhabits the building once known as "Craft Cabin 2." The studio is complete with 10 wheels, 3 kilns, a slab roller, and everything needed to create handmade pottery from start to finish – including resident potter and instructor, Bob Isenberg. The studio is used for classes, events, lessons, and "open studio time" for up to 10 potters at a time.

Pottery Classes: Our studio has space, tools, and equipment for up to 10 participants. Individuals may register for one of our scheduled beginner pottery classes, schedule private lessons with the artist, or purchase session passes to use open studio time to practice, create, fire, glaze, and complete projects. Groups may also reserve full class sessions or a private party.

Pottery for Sale: There are beautiful pieces of pottery in the Woodland Studio available for purchase during studio hours or by appointment. Pottery makes great gifts! Bob also takes commissions for custom work.

Woodland Blacksmithing and Forge

The Woodland Forge is a complete blacksmith shop currently with four student stations and a teaching station. The blacksmith shop has coal forges, leg vises, hand tools, and multiple styles of anvils – everything to start and complete a project.

Blacksmithing Classes: No prior experience necessary. All materials and supplies are included. These classes are designed as an introduction to using the forge, hand tools, vise, and anvils. It will start you on the path to developing the core skills of smithing: drawing, tapering, hot cutting, hot punching, forge welding, bending, twisting, scrolls, and leaves.

Woodland Fiber Arts – Beginner Quilting, Weaving, Drop-Spindle Spinning Classes

Students are advised in purchasing fabric before the class. All other supplies are included – even a sewing machine. These classes are designed as an introduction in the basics of each discipline. Our intention is that even the least experienced person will leave with a completed project.

What is Coming Up In the WCFAC?

The Gallery: We are currently constructing a gallery building in the Camp Shaulis area to serve as a place to display and sell works of artists directly involved with the Woodland Center as well as guest artist materials. We are looking to complete the building and host an opening event this year.

Class Offering Expansion: Under development are cooking classes, painting, and more!

Camp Blast!

Camp Blast is a day full of FUN that highlights all that Lutherlyn has to offer. There will be a sampling of ALL of the FUN things to do at camp in the summer (horseback riding, campfire, crafts, gaga, archery, high ropes course, zipline, bouldering room, hikes, nature activities, canoeing, hay rides, games, sports, archaeology, water rockets, disk golf, kayaking, biking, and LOTS more).

There will also be tours, displays and activities that highlight the "second season" (non-summer) things going on at Lutherlyn, great food, worship, and presentations.

Camp Blast is intended to be an opportunity for friends of camp to bring NEW faces to Lutherlyn! Please save the date and invite friends who are not familiar with camp. This is going to be a HUGE day for LUTHERLYN and we hope that YOU will be a part of it and bring others! Not yet convinced that this is THE DAY to be at camp??? How about this.... EVERYTHING IS FREE!!!

No Registration Required.

Last Year this event has seen upwards of 1,200 people and over 100 summer camp registrations. This is an important event for the Ambassadors to promote. We could also use your help in volunteering during this day if you are not caravanning hordes of people.

Camp Blast will be happening on Saturday, May 7.

Adventure Programs

A day in the Lutherlyn Adventure Program holds challenges that draw people closer together, help individuals stretch their talents and abilities, and teach youth and adults skills valuable for a lifetime. Participants of all ages who have comes to a Lutherlyn Adventure programs experience the opportunity to learn new skills, expand their horizons, make new friends, and hopefully discover a new passion.

Adventure Programs at Lutherlyn are highly customizable for each group. Programs can vary from short one hour workshops all the way up to weekend or longer retreats/events. Throughout the year, over 1,000 people participate in the Lutherlyn Adventure Program. This program includes Ropes Course and Rock Climbing programs within which participants learn to push their boundaries and encourage others as they do the same. All activities are supervised by Lutherlyn's trained and experienced staff.

Low Ropes Course / Group Building: Lutherlyn's low ropes course is used a part of summer programming as well as any interested second season group. Programming can be designed to accomplish many different goals including but not limited too: group bonding/formation, improving communication skills, goal setting, taking risks, faith formation, building trust and confidence, and creativity. Every program is custom tailored based on group leader's observations and desires for the group.

High Ropes Course and Zipline: Lutherlyn's high ropes course and zipline offers a great experience and challenge to participants. Entry to the course can be obtained by several different methods: a 48 foot tall climbing wall, Cargo Net, and a Giant's Ladder. Once on the course, participants have the option of traversing 5 elements high above the ground, or simply enjoying the 860 foot zipline ride! The more adventurous may want to try their hand at the pamper pole, which is sure to get anyone's heart racing!

On-Site Adventures: Many of our off site adventures can also be offered at Lutherlyn as an addition to any retreat or group. These programs utilize Lutherlyn's beautiful grounds as well as our climbing tower and chimney, and our indoor bouldering room. All programs on or off-site are lead by highly trained staff!

Off-Site Adventures: Off- site adventures at Lutherlyn are offered as both public programming where anyone can call in and sign up, or private programming for individuals and groups from all backgrounds. Many of our excursions are held close to Lutherlyn, but trips to state parks and destinations further away occur on a frequent basis. Lutherlyn currently offers programming in: Mountain Biking, Kayaking/Canoeing, Backpacking, and Rock Climbing and Rappelling. All programs on or off-site are lead by highly trained staff!

Adult Break-Out Adventures: Many of the programs run at Lutherlyn are geared towards youth. This program is geared specifically to adults! Different adventures are offered throughout the year and include activities such as: High ropes course/zipline, mountain biking, rock climbing, hiking, horseback riding, canoeing, and more! All adventures include training, equipment, and a lunch. Days are typically started with a safety briefing or learning basic skills, and then the remainder of the day is spent having fun and making new friends!

Our trained staff will leads groups through a sequence of energizing, icebreaking activities all the way through complex initiatives that will challenge all members of the organization/group. Program lengths and sizes can vary from short 60 minute icebreaker workshops with 10 individuals all the way up to full day programs hosting 50 participants.

Programs at Lutherlyn are usually accompanied with a printed brochure to accommodate those who rarely use computers or like the "tried and true" method of communication. These brochures along with periodic appeals are sent to homes and churches through the postal service.

General Suggestions for Promotion

- 1. **Keep informed** by reading newsletters and other information pieces.
- 2. Attend the Ambassador's training.

3. **Promote Summer Camp** attendance by:

- Having a camp Sunday each spring
- Inviting a camp staff or board member to make a Sunday School Presentation
- Having a camper give a temple talk in Sunday School or worship
- Having a camp bulletin board in a prominent place
- Visiting Lutherlyn for a congregational picnic or tour
- Encouraging campers to attend the Winter Retreats
- Personally visiting with potential campers and their parents
- Giving a temple talk at worship
- Seeking campership funds
- Having a brief dedication service during worship for the children and families who will be attending camp
- Distributing brochures to all Sunday School students
- Interview returning campers and inform the Camp Director of any problems or concerns

4. Promote summer camping employment opportunities

- Make application materials available to interested students in your congregation.
- Talk with potential staff and volunteers about opportunities to serve on the summer staff.
- Encourage potential nurses, grandparents, chaplains, maintenance personnel, and others with special skills or interests to contact Lutherlyn about volunteering.

5. Promote retreats

A retreat is a powerful tool for Christian education and building congregational fellowship. It can also provide an environment for getting work done without distraction. By providing time apart from daily distractions, a retreat offers large blocks of time for study, discussion, decision-making, planning, getting to know one another, and having fun. Common retreats are church council planning, workshops for church volunteers, youth groups, WELCA meetings, committee meetings, confirmation weekends, and family or couples retreats. Although congregations are responsible for their own program, help is available for planning retreats.

Some suggestions for planning retreats:

- Visit the facilities during daylight hours.
- · Make reservations well in advance of your event.
- Arrange for food service.
- Develop clearly stated goals for your event.
- Select materials, a process, and a style that will help you reach your goals.
- Develop your schedule to allow some time for hiking and recreation that takes advantage of the camp setting.
- Check with the camp office regarding the availability of any special resources you may require.

The Development Office

Lutherlyn Campership Fund

Lutherlyn has a promise. This promise is that no child shall be unable to attend summer camp due to financial circumstances. This promise is huge! Each year Lutherlyn grants over \$35,000 in campership funds (mostly in the form of half-camperships).

The Campership Fund is maintained by the consistent, faithful giving of our Trinity Pines Club members, Campership Endowments, and special fundraising events throughout the year (Golf Outing, Pie Auction, Quilt Show and Auctions, Winter Tea, and other events).

SUGGESTIONS FOR PAYING FOR THE CAMPING EXPERIENCE

- Many congregations include an amount for camperships in their budget. Some congregations pay:
 - 1. The registration fee
 - 2. Half the camper's fee
 - 3. The total fee for all campers
 - 4. Part or all of the fee for campers who cannot afford a week at camp.
- Camperships in some congregations are promoted by the WELCA, LMM, or Sunday Church Schools.
- Camperships for those who need more help than the congregation can offer, may be requested from Lutherlyn. Any Lutheran pastor may request these.
- Christmas Gift Certificates for all or part of a week at camp may be obtained from Lutherlyn.
- Encourage individuals in your congregation to "send a child to camp."
- Encourage individuals and your congregation to make special gifts to Lutherlyn's ministry. Gifts may be designated for one of several funds.
 - 1. Camperships
 - 2. Campership Endowment
 - 3. Annual Fund to support the overall ministry of the camp.
 - 4. Toward established special projects

The Trinity Pines Club

The Trinity Pines Club was initiated in the spring of 1986. The club was established from a desire and interest to remain involved in the dreams and hopes of Lutherlyn and its campers. This club serves as a strong and continuing base of financial and prayer support for our ministry.

Since 1948 Lutherlyn has been providing a Christian camp experience for children, youth, church groups, adults, and seniors. As a ministry, Lutherlyn has sought to provide a place where people of all ages might grow in faith.

Over the years, many generations of our people have grown to love Lutherlyn for what it has meant to them, to their children, and to their congregations. The story of Lutherlyn is one of many people who have given their time, talent, and treasure to make this ministry possible.

The Trinity Pines Club has grown from a handful of charter members to an annual membership of nearly **500** individuals, families, and organizations.

Membership is granted simply to those who give \$100 or more to Lutherlyn in a calendar year and is renewable annually.

Monthly Recurring Donations

Lutherlyn takes advantage of the Simply Giving program offered through Thrivent Financial Services. Through this program we are able to establish monthly recurring donation accounts for our donors.

Campership Endowments

The Endowed Campership Fund is an attractive way to provide camperships to kids who would otherwise be unable to attend camp. Several named and endowed camperships have been established at Lutherlyn over the years -- benefitting deserving campers annually.

When a gift is "endowed", the initial principal is preserved in perpetuity and awards are made from the annual earnings. This, simply stated provides a level of current support, while providing a reliable source of funds for the future. *An endowed gift is a gift that keeps on giving*. Endowed gifts may be restricted for specific purposes, such as camperships, program support, staff development, etc. They may also be given unrestricted, allowing Lutherlyn to use the annual earnings where the need is greatest. Endowed gifts make up a significant part of Lutherlyn's Endowment Fund and hold the key to the future strength and vitality of Lutherlyn and its ministry.

The Circle of Life

The Circle of Life is an organization of caring people who are committed to helping assure the financial stability of Lutherlyn for generations to come. They express their concern and give concrete help by including Lutherlyn in their thoughtful estate planning.

The donor may direct the estate gifts to be used for providing children the opportunity to attend Lutherlyn; or for capital improvements at Lutherlyn; or for other programs and services offered by Lutherlyn. Undesignated funds which the Board of Trustees can use where needed are always greatly appreciated. It is up to the donor to decide where the money goes.

Circle of Life Members, by including Lutherlyn in their estate plans are assuring this ministry will continue long into the future. Members are also benefiting themselves as they make gifts from their estates.

Annual Benefit Golf Outing

This Golf Outing began in 1989 by the late Rev. Pat Maier. The outing took a few years off in the early 2000's but has been going strong once again since 2009. The golf outing takes place at Oakview Golf Course in Slippery Rock, PA on the Friday before Memorial Day in late May. The event includes 18 holes of golf with cart (two carts per foursome), a hot dog lunch during registration, and an awards dinner. The golf outing brings in around \$12,000 in registrations and sponsorships each year.

Woodland Quilters/Quilt Show and Auctions & Sales

The Woodland Quilters guild was established in the Fall of 2004 in response to the need to cover the interior walls of the dining hall. Quilting has since become a way of life for many of the Woodland Quilters. Four retreats dedicated to quilting, scrapbooking, and crafts are now hosted each year, filling the large dining hall with up to 70 people. The Woodland Quilters have themselves transitioned from decorating the walls of Lutherlyn to also raising funds for camp through their quilts. Each fall a quilt show is hosted at Lutherlyn and each spring two quilt auctions are hosted by churches within western Pennsylvania. Both the quilt show and auctions raise money for the Campership Fund. In 2012, the Woodland Quilters were honored with the Cornerstone Award.

Winter Tea

Winter Tea is a fundraiser held in March. Tables are reserved by a host/hostess who fills their table with guests (friends/family) and decorates their table. The day includes tea (hosts provide tea sets), desserts, music, raffle prizes, and a reward for the best decorated table.

Annual "Under the Radar" Campaign

Each summer an "Under the Radar" project is chosen, designed to help a community in need somewhere in the world. Past projects have included Pigs for Haiti, Wells for Madagascar, and the Anti-Malaria Campaign for Africa.

Buy a Brick/Friendship Way

Installed is a pathway off the porch of the Dining Hall known as Friendship Way. Individuals may purchase a customized brick for themselves or someone else as a permanent part of Lutherlyn. Bricks are ordered twice yearly.

Volunteering at Lutherlyn

Work Days

Each year there are two scheduled two work days (spring and fall). This is a day where individuals and groups come and work on projects on camp grounds. Projects range from picking up sticks and raking leaves to a roofing project (tasks are given based on level of skill/ability). Groups are welcome to arrange their own work days as well by contacting the office.

Specialty Trade Volunteers

Available and always welcome are opportunities for people with a professional/industrial skill or certification. We welcome electricians, carpenters, plumbers, auto mechanics, contractors, professional advertisers, equine specialists, and more.

Building for the Future of Lutherlyn

For 68 years Lutherlyn has been ministering and keeping its promise to train leaders and to provide "growing in faith" experiences for Lutherans in western Pennsylvania. In that time dozens of people have been inspired to enter church vocations while at Lutherlyn. Thousands more have been empowered to be leaders in their congregations. Tens of thousands have been nurtured in their faith.

In that time, over 2 million meals have been prepared in our kitchen; hundreds of thousands of people have spent nights to remember in those concrete block cabins built in the 40's, 50's and early 60's; tens of millions of gallons of water have come from the ground and returned, and our facilities have served 4 generations of campers. Time, weather, and hard use have worn away at the cabins and the activity and service buildings that support the program but with the support of may people who love and value Lutherlyn, we have been working hard to keep our facilities fit and ready to welcome generations to come.

The continuation and growth of the ministry necessitates retooling and expanding our facility. Much has been done and much still needs to be done to assure that Lutherlyn can continue to keep the old promises in this new century.

- **Dining Hall:** We have a modern dining hall. This beautiful building features three dining/meeting rooms, beautiful cedar siding, central air conditioning, and central gas heating. The largest room serves 200 people for meetings or dining. A second room serves 125 individuals, and the smaller fireside room serves 25.
- Cabins: Since 1987, we have replaced ALL 20 of our old block cabins in main camp with a four new cabin villages of five cabins each. The villages' names: A-Frame/Forest Village, Log Cabin Village, Ridge Village, and Arbor Village. Each cabin is equipped with 2 full baths, carpeting, paneling and central heat. The last village in main camp was completed in 2006.
- Camp Shaulis: A plan is being established to convert this older part of camp into the home of the Woodland Center for Arts and Crafts. A gallery building is currently nearing completion and plans are being made to build studios, living spaces, and a community building.
- Worship and Music Center: Building is nearing completion and will serve as a functional worship space.
- Water System: We have an aerated pond system capable of handling 20,000 gallons of sewage per day. We also have a drinking water treatment plant on line that many folks say provides better water than they have at home. Major repairs were made to both facilities in late 2012.
- Office Space: Inadequate for today's staff and particularly for storage of records required by law.
- Rice Hall and Derr Hall: Our large meeting buildings that serve us as recreation centers on rainy days, meeting space for large retreats, over flow program space for environmental education, and as summer camp program space are in need of repair to preserve them. Rice Hall got the main section of a new pitched roof in 2000 and Derr Hall (the Education Building) got a new core roof in 2002 with extension over the classrooms in 2003. A bouldering room was installed and an indoor Gaga Pit was built in 2012. The building is slowly being transformed into an activity center for summer camp and retreat programs/groups.
- Wallace Hall: The large building adjacent to the swimming pool has been remodeled into a meeting hall with new bathrooms and changing areas for swimmers.
- **Pool:** A pool replacement, named "Fill the Pool" project was initiated in 2013. The campaign has surpassed its goal of \$150,000 and construction on the new pool will be completed by summer 2016.
- **Indoor Riding Arena:** Constructed in the end of 2015. This addition allows for year-round equestrian programing.

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR PARENTS:

Dear Parent(s),

Thank you so much for registering your child for a wonderful week at Lutherlyn! We are going to have a great week full of life-changing adventures in faith! We know that you are putting a lot of trust in us by leaving your child with us for a week. Our staff are well trained and prepared to act "in loco parentis" (in place of a reasonable parent) while your child is in our care. Some of the precautions that we take to assure that your child is safe at Lutherlyn are:

- All of the staff go through a thorough application and interview process. Only the best are chosen... only staff that we would trust with our own children.
- We do a criminal background check, a check of the national registry of sex offenders, and check 3 references for every potential employee.
- Each staff person signs Lutherlyn's staff policies and violation means termination.
- Our two week staff training program includes Red Cross First Aid & CPR, emergency procedures, homesickness, all the elements prescribed by the American Camp Association (ACA) – and more!
- There is at least one nurse living on the site each week. All medications and health forms are kept locked in the health hut to prohibit unauthorized access to camper's personal information and medications.
- Lutherlyn's Directors live only minutes away and are available to the Summer Staff 24/7 for any sort of incident or emergency throughout the summer.

There are many more but these are some of the measures that we take to ensure your child's safety.

There are things that you can do to help ensure that your child's week at camp is successful. Please share with them how excited you are for the AWESOME experience they are going to have! Tell them that you will miss them, but please do not dwell on how hard it will be for you to send them to camp. (Believe it or not, we have had several homesick campers who really wanted to have fun but were worried that mom was missing them too much!) It is generally not helpful to share stories about cabin raids, hazing, or scary experiences you may have had or heard about... none of that happens at Lutherlyn! Reassure your child that Lutherlyn is a safe place where they will HAVE FUN, be cared for, experience new things, and grow in their faith!

We also know that some parents find it difficult to go a whole week without talking with their child. Lutherlyn adheres to a strict "no cell phone" policy. Here's why:

- The safety of your child is our first concern. When campers are able to make phone calls from camp, it creates a potential for "unexpected visitors." The ACA reports that they can also create alarm among parents and in the media in the event of an emergency at camp by spreading partial or inaccurate information.
- Camp is an opportunity for campers to "live in the moment" in an "intentional Christian community" in a "place apart." The distraction of phone contact dilutes the experience rather than enhancing it.
- Along with growth in faith, the camp experience is intended to help kids become independent, to build social skills, emotional resilience, and, in a place committed to their success and well-being, to stand on their own. They simply do better and grow more, when they are allowed to do that on their own.

Please help us enforce this policy. Please DO NOT allow your child to bring a cell phone to camp!
