



Our summer Bible Study theme was "Hear and Live". We learned about listening and hearing God's Word in a busy and noisy world. Every camper experienced this through morning devotions, Bible study, worship, and candle power each day.

Our Wednesday theme was a Canterbury Festival. We had a picnic dinner and played medieval games every Wednesday evening.

na has been a great asset to our programming. Lessons, homeschool classes, and lots of other programs continue to happen! The completion of this project is a great success for our nearly forty year old program.

This year we are really putting a concentrated effort to grow our therapeutic riding program. This is something we have wanted to do here at Lutherlyn for many years and we finally



have the tools to do it. The indoor arena is providing great stability to the scheduling of programs. In addition to the indoor we have two PATH certified therapeutic riding instructors available to run programming. Katey Simons and Teresa Davis have joined the team at Lutherlyn Equestrian Center. They are both certified through AAHS and through PATH International as a Therapeutic Riding instructor. Katey holds a degree in Equine Studies



from Centenary College, and has experience in many aspects of the equine field. She has been teaching horseback riding since 2005 and Therapeutic Riding since 2013. Teresa Davis has

been a steady volunteer for 3 years and now manages a lot of the day to day things at the barn. She is completing her bachelors in psychology and social work. She was a volunteer thera-

peutic riding instructor for years and she works in the adult group home setting. Together these two woman have a variety of experience and knowledge to share. We are seeking both participants (age 6+) and volunteers (age 14+) to help bring this program to life. We had the pleasure of being a stop on the Butler County Farm Tour in October. Over 1,000 guests visited the Lutherlyn Equestrian Center that day; mostly people who have never been to Lutherlyn before. Visitors had the opportunity to take a tour, go on a pony ride, pet and

visit the horses, do an Environmental Education activity, and play some games. It was an exciting day and we are so appreciative to the Butler County Tourism Bureau for including us on the Farm Tour.

We do have one additional need that every farmer knows is essential to running a farm – a tractor. Last summer the engine on our mower finally called it quits.

We contacted many repair shops and no one was able to find the necessary parts to repair our machine. We limped along this summer, getting the main camp mower when we could – but our grounds have suffered. It was hard to keep the weeds down in the fields and around the jumps and out buildings. Our largest (and most dangerous to the horses) problem was maintaining the fence lines. When you do not keep the weeds and growth off of your fence it shorts out the electric fencer. Once the horses figure out the electric does not work, they begin testing the waters to escape. Unfortunately, this time of year the grass is greener on the other side of our fence! If anyone out there knows of a tractor without a job please contact us! We would gladly accept the donation and put that tractor to good use!



A DEER OF A DIFFERENT COLOR

Visitors to Lutherlyn in the last year and a half may have had the chance to catch a glimpse of a rare sight – a piebald deer. A piebald is a color variation of whitetail deer with some patches of white fur and some patches of brown fur. The piebald deer we have seen at Lutherlyn is a female which was first seen after the spring of 2015. She is most often spotted along the main Lutherlyn driveway, between Dick Road and the bottom of the hill, often in the section of forest between the driveway and the stables. Her head and neck are brown with some patches of white, while the rest of her body and legs are mostly white. She is quite a sight to see!

Piebalds are different from albino deer. Albinos have a recessive gene that causes them to have no melanin at all in their body. Along with all white fur, this gives albino deer pink noses and eyes and white hooves. The chances of an albino deer being born are only 1 in 20,000.

Piebald deer have a genetic variation or defect that produces white fur on some parts of the deer's body. The eyes, nose, and hooves are normal color. Other defects often occur along with the piebald color variation, including short legs, arching spine (scoliosis), short lower mandible, bowing of the nose (often called Roman nose), and even some internal organ deformities. The piebald deer at Lutherlyn does appear to have shorter legs than the other whitetail deer around her.

Piebald deer are much more common than true albino deer, but are still rare – it is estimated that less than 1% of the whitetail deer population in average areas are piebalds. If piebald deer mate with normally-pigmented deer, the offspring could be either piebald or normally colored deer.

Keep an eye out while you are driving in the main driveway from Dick Road, and you may catch a glimpse of this rare and beautiful part of God's creation!
