WELCOMING. HOSPITABLE. SAFE.

Whether "rustic" or "modern", Lutherlyn aims to be welcoming and hospitable to all who come for summer camp or retreats. Over the years, the well-used Shaulis cabins have deteriorated beyond repair. Each summer, they require excessive maintenance and upkeep to use "the best" 5 for campers and staff. The "worst" 5 are not usable. As camp has grown and activities have expanded, attendees tell us they prefer to stay closer to main campus rather than be so far from the dining hall and other main buildings and activity areas.

The amphitheater, a sacred and beloved space for many – especially our summer campers, too, is deteriorating. After 40 years, benches are sinking into the soil, steps and walkways have shifted due to decades of erosion making the terrain less safe for guests. Securing the structural integrity of this space is critical to provide a welcoming and hospitable environment for worship.



5 NEW CABINS

Lodging is a first-line impression of Lutherlyn's hospitality. The Shaulis cabins, built in 1958, have served this ministry well, housing thousands of campers over those years. Unfortunately, weather and wear have exhausted these buildings.

To replace these accommodations, a new 5-cabin village will be built on main camp between the pool and the a-frames cabins. This winterized village, complete with upgraded utilities and an access road, will be professionally constructed to meet current building codes. The single village will accommodate Lutherlyn's pre-pandemic summer camp enrollment while also allowing for an increased number of guests during the retreat season.

A second 5-cabin village to accommodate seasonal staff and volunteers is planned as funding becomes available. This second village is part of the *Building for the Future* challenge goal.

STEININGER MEMORIAL AMPHITHEATER

The amphitheater is one of Lutherlyn's most beloved spaces. In this sacred space, we gather in God's creation for worship, campers are affirmed in their faith, couples vow their love and commitment, retreat groups worship and receive communion in nature. We don't want to change a thing!

To secure the structural stability of this site, footings and foundations will be placed to minimize further sinking of benches and uneven walkways. These measures will retain the look and feel of the amphitheater while preserving its use for decades to come.
